Here we would like to deal specifically with the question of North Americans who organize around their homosexuality, for two reasons. First, the practice of the outspoken mainstream of the gay movement on relation to Cuba is a clear manifestation of some of the things we talked about above (e.g., defending "one's right" as an end in itself, disappointment due to misconceiving socialism as a flowless paradise misinterpreting "people in power," small group mentality, etc.).

Second, the Cuban people, opening a full discussion on homosexuality, have come to a certain perspective on its origin and its historical development within Cuba. They have done so by examining the role of homosexuals within the revolutionary context of the society. The present conclusion of this discussion is that homosexuality in Cuba is a social pathology left over from the decadent bourgeois order.

Since the BV is an anti-imperialist educational project with four Political Objectives directed at the Cuban Revolution, other struggles of the Third World, and the North American Movement those two aspects have clear implications for the 5th BV. In short, we felt that however else the gay movement may be progressing in other aspects of its practice within the US, we believe that the path it has generally taken regarding Cuba (generally anti-Cuban) is dangerous and incorrect and must be corrected if the gay movement is to move in a consistently anti-imperialist direction.

Generally, the past activities of the gay North Americans have been destructive. A list of specific activities would include "re-educating the Cubans" (assuming that the situation in Cuba must be the same as that of the US), outright attacks and denunciations on the Cuban Revolution, "boycotts," remaining silent and allowing incorrect tendencies to flourish unchallenged, etc.

In general, homosexuals in Cuba have not participated in the revolutionary process. They have existed side by side with the Revolution, and are essentially parasites in the revolution. (It must be noted that there are a few exceptions however, here we are not concerned with individuals and individual actions, but with groups and group actions.) This has been the reality of homosexuals in Cuba; and it is on this basis that their conclusions rest. (This basis has nothing to do with the policy demanding all brigadistas to strive to be consistent anti-imperialists both in theory and practice, in words and in action. Cultural imperialist activity is not and will not be tolerated on the BV. Clearly, this is the only logical position that an anti-imperialist project can take.)

These activities are particularly dangerous at this time because they join a cultural imperialist offensive against the Cuban Revolution carried out by US imperialism in an attempt to discredit the Revolution and alienate North Americans from it.

Secondly, the above manifestations tend to distort the gay movement's perspective on Cuba's position on homosexuality in Cuba. This reaches such absurdities as feeling that the Cuban Revolution is "witching-hunting" for homosexuals so as to oppress them because of their homosexuality in Cuba.

In light of this tendency, a high degree of political conciousness is required in order to prevent these distortions from getting out of hand.

Some gay Northamericans have said that we are asking them to go "back in the closet." This is a clear example of a distortion of the BV policy demanding all bregadistas to strive to be consistent anti-imperialists, both in theory and in practice, in works and in action. Cultural imperialist activity is not and will not be tolerated on the BV. Clearly, this is the only logical position that an anti-imperialist project can take.

DON'T BUY IT

The "Revolutionary Communist Party", which publishes the Revolutionary Worker, and Revolution, has repeatedly published attacks on lesbians and gay men. Here are a few examples:

From the current RCP Program:

"As for homosexuality, this too, is perpetuated and fostered by the decay of capitalism, especially as it sinks into deeper crisis. This is particularly the case because of the distorted, oppressive man-woman relations capitalism promotes. Once the proletariat is in power, no one will be discriminated against in jobs, housing and the like merely on the basis of being a homosexual. But at the same time education will be conducted throughout society on the ideology behind homosexuality and its material roots in exploiting society, and struggle will be waged to eliminate it and reform homosexuals." (page 77)

From the Revolutionary Worker:

"[the RCP considers]...homosexuality, especially male homosexuality, to be a manifestation of bourgeois decadence..." (1986)

From Revolution, Spring 1988:

"homosexuality serves as both a reflection and a concentration of some of the worst features of the exploitative relations between men and women..." "In brief, the heart of our disagreement with lesbianism is that in the final analysis lesbianism, and even radical lesbianism, represents and promotes a dead-end "alternative" to the dominant oppressive relations and an incorrect understanding of the source of women's oppression."

"But most homosexuals (male and female) do make the question of their sexuality, and sexuality in general, the essential and defining question of their life and identity and the focal point of their political and ideological perspective. This, and the misogyny of the ideology underlying male homosexuality, certainly does hinder the class struggle and specifically the struggle to combat the oppression of women."

"(The fact that an inordinate preoccupation with sexuality is a feature of homosexuality generally-even if this is generally far more so among male homosexuals and often far more grotesque in its expression among a significant section of them-should once again be a tipoff as to the basic problems with the outlook concentrated in homosexuality.)"


As lesbians and gay men, we get enough of this kind of garbage from the Traditional Values Coalition, Jesse Helms, and the Church. We don't need it from our supposed allies.

The people selling the Revolutionary Worker will tell you that their anti-gay politics aren't important, what's important is fighting the government. We agree, fighting the government is important. And for progressive people, fighting the government includes fighting, not perpetuating, heterosexism. If their anti-gay politics aren't important, why don't they change them?

The issue isn't whether we will build a lesbian/gay movement that just tries to get a piece of the pie in the system, or whether we will join anti-gay revolutionaries to overthrow it. There are hundreds of lesbians and gay men in the Bay Area who are working with pride for revolutionary change, in dozens of groups of various ideologies and structures.

The RCP doesn't admit openly gay people, yet they seem to want to use us and our movements to sell their papers. Are they setting up their tables at gay day as part of their struggle to reform homosexuals? They can't have it both ways. Tell them something creative to do with their newspapers. Tell them that HOMOPHOBIAISN'T REVOLUTIONARY, IT'S THE SAME OLD SHIT.

Gay Liberation, Not Just Gay Rights!

In October, hundreds of thousands of lesbians and gay men will be converging on Washington, D.C. The march will include a broad spectrum of politics, and we can be proud that when our comunities come together it is on such a progressive basis as was developed in the November convention which called the March. And yet, as important as the March is, there is a need to go further. Because the fight for lesbian and gay liberation has been replaced by the demand for gay rights. Therefore, we are calling for a gay and lesbian liberation contingent and also a get-together, in Wash. D.C.

As lesbians and gay men we threaten the very basis of this white, straight, male-dominated society. This is not always a conscious choice and of course many gay people spend their lives trying to fit into this society. But the society cannot tolerate lesbians and gay men because we defy its basic social unit, the heterosexual family. By living outside of established sex and gender roles we expose that they are neither natural nor inevitable nor freely chosen. And by placing our own identities ahead of societal validation or approval we challenge the basic idea that this society can determine who or how we will be.

Our community is faced with the AIDS epidemic. The same government that created the epidemic by failing to respond to the first AIDS cases is now determined to use that epidemic to destroy us. We are faced with a rise in anti-gay attacks, racist violence, institutionalized racism, a worsening economic depression, an attempt to take away even the most basic of rights for women and a rise in the organized right. Many in our community say that these times call for abandoning large sectors of our community and many of our demands in favor of joining mainstream Democratic Party politics. We disagree. It is no accident that the first gay organizations that emerged after Stonewall called ourselves things like the Gay Liberation Front, seeing ourselves as engaged in as serious and basic a struggle as were the people of Vietnam. In critical times like these, we need this kind of far-reaching perspective.

What's Wrong With Rights?

Of course, we are in favor of and fight for any rights that we can get within the system. But the struggle for civil rights within the context of this society can, at best, result in second class status and toleration by a wretched straight society. The struggle for democratic or civil rights assumes that the system is basically ok and that its flaws can be corrected through legal reform. We think gay oppression's roots are much deeper and it is not enough just to legislate against them. We demand an immediate end to all forms of anti-gay oppression, including the abolition of anti-gay laws like the sodomy laws, and we demand an end to all laws and policies that enforce or favor the nuclear family. We demand an end to the repression of lesbian and gay male sexuality. We demand the right of all lesbians and gay men, and children to live in the manner we choose.


When we do not have any power, the society that "granted" the rights can also take them away. We only need to look at the experience of the women's and Black movements to see the limitations of civil rights legislation to address the underlying causes of oppression.

We do not accept the analysis implicit in the struggle for civil rights that same sex love be tolerated as a minority experience only. Because of the heterosexist nature of this society, most people have not explored their potential for same sex love. We are determined to create the conditions that will allow this potential the freedom to develop in everyone, and we refuse to accept the view that gayness is an 'alternative' or a 'variation' from some assumed heterosexual norm.

We refuse to define our lives within the society as it is now structured. We can't stand the jobs they want us to work and the schools they want us to go to. We refuse to have the relationships they want us to have; to grow up the way they want us to grow up; to age the way they want us to die. We will determine our own lives.

Rather than an isolated struggle for gay rights, we will participate as whole human beings in a process with other oppressed peoples to restructure the world. This is our struggle for lesbian and gay liberation.

What this means in the context of the demands for the national march is that we look at them differently. For example, when we say that we want to validate gay relationships, we mean all relationships among lesbians and gay men, not just the ones (long term couples) that are closest to the model of the heterosexual family. We urge lesbians and gay men to celebrate all their relationships—sexual and nonsexual, long term or short term, monogamous, non-monogamous or anonymous—and we fight the idea that safe sex equals monogamy or no sex.

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PRINCIPLES OF UNITY

LESBIANS AND GAYS AGAINST INTERVENTION

Lesbians and Gays Against Intervention (LAGAI) was formed in December, 1983, by the membership of the Lesbian/Gay Taskforce of the El Salvador Initiative Campaign in San Francisco, California, USA. The Initiative called for an end to all military aid to El Salvador. After the victory of the Initiative and our effective work as a taskforce, we saw the necessity of continuing our work. We wanted to remain an autonomous gay group in opposition to the role of the US government and corporations in Central America and the Carribean. US corporations profit handsomely from the control they exercise over the economies in this region. The US government acts hand in hand with these aims as the military/political force which keeps this system of economic slavery institutionalized. This results in the dissolution of local autonomy and a blatant disregard for human rights. As residents and citizens of the US, we elect to support and join in the struggle for freedom and self determination in Latin America.

Points of Focus:

1)Stopping US intervention in Central America and the Carribean: LAGAI's main purpose and major focus is combatting the US government's aggresive role in the internal affairs of Latin America. As residents of the US, we think we have an important role to play in halting the expansion of imperialism. It is imperative that we actively support the popular peoples' struggles in Central America and the Carribean for self determination.

2)Creating gay visibility in the solidarity Movement:
The effectiveness of the US solidarity movement will be measured by its ability to mobilize the many sectors of the US population.
"Mass" organizations have generally failed to activate a representative percentage of ethnic, racial and sexual minorities into anti-intervention work. We support the formation of groups whose aim is to organize these various sectors. In light of this, we think the lesbians' and gay mens' communities can be more effectively mobilized by a gay group at this time. Many gay people are involved at all levels of solidarity work, but our contributions can be down played because of homophobia and our own internalized oppression. LAGAI will fight homophobia in the solidarity movement by creating a visible presence of progressive lesbians and gay men, working in coalition with other solidarity groups.

3)Working with progressive Carribean and Central American groups: LAGAI will contact the various Central American and Carribean organizations in the San Francisco Bay Area which are working against US intervention. We will work toward building mutually supportive relationships. We support their just struggles for self determination and human rights. We aim to raise consciousness about the lesbians' and gay mens' communities in order to further a better understanding of gay liberation in the US and Latin America.

Revolting Lesbians - Principles of Unity and Herstory

I. Who We Are

We are an all-lesbian group that began in 1983 We began as a study group and have since become an action/affinity group. Our purpose is to bring together lesbian/feminist and leftist politics, and give us our own lesbian group in which to talk about ideas and events and to plan actions. We have a reage of age, practice, theory and life experience and types of political involvement.

How Our Meetings Work

Meetings and choosing projects. We meet every other week with meetings alternating between San Francisco and the East Bay. We operate on sort of an anarchist model: we do not have pre-set agendas or leaders, so that every member is free to express her opinions/knowledge/ideas.

For those truly impossible discussions when one member is strongly in opposition to the rest of the group, we have adopted the following handy rule: someone must take her side (at least for awhile). This prevents her feeling completely isolated/outnumbered, and maximizes group respect.


HI. Principles of Unity


- 1. We are all Lesbians. We think it is important that there are groups of Lesbians that work together as Lesbians. We bring a Lesbian presence to the left. We believe in coalitions.
- 2. We are revolutionaries. We're not working for changes within the system. We are for overthrowing the government.
- 3. We are opposed to lesbian/gay oppression, racism, capitalism, imperialism, sexism, classism, anti-Semitism, elitism, fat oppression, ageism, oppression based on a physical or mental condition, and all other oppressions perpetuated by capitalism and patriarchy. We're not into nukes either, or the destruction of the environment.
- 4. RL is an independent group. None of us are members of any cadre organization. Before this could be changed, the ramifications would have to be discussed in RL.
- 5 We are not Zionists; some of us are anti-Zionists. We are all against the policies of the Israeli government.

- 5. We support the intifada and the right of the Palestinian people to self-determination.

- 5. We are against u.s. imperialism, whether it is economic, military, open or covert (such as COINTELPRO activities, and the police and military intervention in the Black community). We are opposed to u.s. intervention everywhere, from Big Mountain to the Persian Gulf. We support the *intifada* and the right of the Palestinian people to self-determination, and independence for Puerto Rico.

Down and Out in the Lesbian Community "LET THEM EAT PUSSY"

by Revolting Lesbians

Last year the Examiner quoted a Bay Area poll stating that the mean income for lesbians is \$32,000 a year. So who are these lesbians and more importantly, how can we meet them?

We are currently a group of middle and working class white lesbians. A few of us have college degrees and we all have some college education as well as other marketable skills. Yet only one of us has an income above \$30,000 a year, and she's being forced out of her job. After conducting our own poll of various groups of lesbians we concluded that this figure of \$32,000 a year was grossly exaggerated. We found that fully employed lesbians are averaging \$16,000 a year, while close to 50% of lesbians are unemployed, on SSI, or partially employed. Many live under the poverty level of \$8,000.

The issue of money or more precisely the lack of it in the lesbian community needs to be addressed. In the u.s. it's not polite to talk about money, or to force someone to look at your poverty. We deny it ourselves, either because it's our own depressing reality, or because we are barely getting by, and the thought of losing it is too threatening. Lesbians with money are indifferent to the issue. Our buying power and resources are shrinking every day. We are feeling the crunch yet according to the media we've never been better.

This is true for lesbians; it is also true for other oppressed groups in this society. Women, lesbians and gays, Puerto Ricans, Blacks, Chicanas, children, old people, and many other subcultures are kept in slavery conditions, underpaid, overworked, maimed, raped and murdered. The more groups you fit into, the more our system will fuck with you and try to drag you down. Until the system changes, we will be oppressed. If lesbians and gays achieved equality, another group would have to be created to oppress. Freedom to make money and buy houses and have children as lesbians is not the major problem. Freedom for us all is where it's at.

Our bootstraps ain't long enough

The myth is that in the u.s. anybody can make it if they work hard enough and are "good" enough. Of course, this is mostly a lie; poor parents have poor children, rich parents have rich children.

When people discuss class, the specific concerns of women are not addressed. Womanhood is a class by itself. Being a woman unattached to a man automatically lowers your economic privilege, no matter what class you come from. Having children lowers your economic and social privilege. Being fat and/or being butch lowers your

Lesbianism is de-classing. The intense discrimination that visible lesbians face in jobs, housing, education, etc. is certainly part of the reason. Lesbianism is also de-classing because of social and family alienation. Teen-aged lesbians often are thrown out or leave home early. They don't get support to start off their adult life. Many lesbians are put in juvenile jails or mental hospitals by their families or other authorities. Therefore they miss the opportunities to get education or training which limits their access to jobs.

Lesbians leave the smaller cities, towns and rural areas and go to big cities and the coasts In Search Of Other Lesbians.* In these cities, de-classed lesbians from various backgrounds occupy a much smaller range of economic class than their parents do, the class structure has been collapsed downward.

Dykes need not apply

Nobody wants to hire a lesbian. Lesbians have no place in corporate culture, which is based on white, straight, male values. Women only have a place to the extent that we mirror and support these values. Women must dress to please and attract men; wear uncomfortable and immobilizing clothes; wear heels, nylons, lipstick, eyeliner, skirts, bras, blouses, nail polish, perfume, hair spray, etc. We also make choices that can not be reversed after hours--like shaving legs, armpits, and faces. We change every expression of who we are in order to get hired, keep our jobs and have a chance at promotion. Changing ourselves, socializing with straight co-workers, pretending to have boyfriends, tolerating dyke/fag jokes all perpetuate anti-lesbian corporate culture and lesbian stereotyping. It also feeds those internal voices that say that we are freaks, and maybe there's something wrong with us, after all. These are choices we make to avoid being treated like lesbians.

Many of us don't even have the choice. Many of us are too butch, too obviously lesbian to ever play straight. Many who might fit in have an added strike against them for being Black, fat, or disabled. We are considered "unpresentable" for jobs that have contact with the public. We are forced to compete for the lowest paying and least desirable blue collar and service jobs.

Job harassment, discrimination, poor work reviews for "not fitting in", co-worker hostility, and last pick for hiring all insure that lesbians will have an erratic work record. Underemployed and unemployed, lesbians have poor or no health insurance, and little access to quality health care. No preventive or maintenance health care and no money to spend except in extreme cases leads to a shorter life expectancy for lesbians than for straight women.

In the u.s. today employers would rather have a conform-







The protest was sparked by the denial of legalization (amnesty) status to some applicants who are HIV positive. 
Sanoe Activists Stage Sit-In; 24 Arrested

AIDS Activists from Stop AIDS Now Or Else held simultaneous demonstrations in the San Francisco and Los Angeles offices of the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service on May 1 to protest INS discrimination against people infected with HIV.

About 60 SANOE/San Francisco members occupied the Sansome Street offices of David Ilchert, regional INS director, late Tuesday afternoon, demanding an immediate halt to mandatory HIV testing by the INS and an end to U.S. entry and travel restrictions based on HIV status.

Twenty-four activists were arrested for holding a sit-down strike inside one of the INS rooms. "I came here to occupy the office because of their unjust policies. What we're doing is really important," one

Protest by AIDS Activists Halts Procession for a Short Time

Only 10 minutes after it started, the 10 ist Tournament of Roses Paralle came to a momentary half Monday when 14 AIDS activists staged a sit-down protest on Colorado Boulevard in front of the Spirit of America's "Pirst Symbols of Piredom" float.

At 8:20 a.m., as several hundred speciators and a handful of network television crews watched, the protesters emerged from the crowd of speciators on the sidewalk and unfuried a banner declaring: "Emergency, Stop the parade, 70.000 doad of AUSS."

Several members of the crowd booed and jecred the protesters. One television station broadcasting the parade turned its cameras to parade Grand Marshal Sen. John Glem (D-Ohio), while another station cut to a commercial

Pasadena police and Los Augeles County sheriff's deputies moved quickly on the protestors, dragging them from the parade route to a nearby side street. The protest halted the parade for less than a minute.

The demonstrators had linked themselves together with a single 30-foot chain, and the nine men and five women slid and bounced

heavily along the ground as the officers pulled them from the street.

"We're protesting because people are dying of AIDS," one male protester said before a sheriff's deputy pushed his face to the payement.

The 14 protesters were booked on suspicion of resisting arrest and unlawful assembly, lave enforcement officials said. The demonstrators were members of SANE (Stop AIDS Now, Or Else), said Bruce Merkin, a spokesman for the group.

"For 70000 people, the parade is overforever," Merkin said, "The government is not doing what is needed" to fight AIDS.

The protest was the only serious disruption of the event, said Lt. Lynn Froistad of the Pasadena Police Dopartment Overall, police made 215 arrests along the parade route between 6 p.m. Sunday and 12:30 p.m. Monday.

Proisted said 192 people were arrested for such alcohol-related violations as disturbing the peace and driving while intexicated. Nine people were arrested for assault and about 30 others for "miscellaneous thefis," Proisted said. More than 100 cars were towed for diegal parking.

"It went very smoothly," Froistad said, "Except for the 235 people we arrested, everyone had a good time."

The Thawing of the Funds

ACT UP/SF's impact and influence on the powers-thatbe at City Hall were again demonstrated in early December. During the last week of November, ACT UP's Local Issues Committee was alerted to the freezing of \$700,000 of Supplemental Funding for AIDS service providers after the earthquake. This money was in danger of being shifted back into the City's General Fund. Beginning on December 1, the Committee initiated a three-pronged attack on City Hall: contacting bureaucrats and city officials and informing them of ACT UP's concern over the freezing of these funds; urging the media to begin investigating the fate of the \$700,000; and contacting the AIDS service providers, whose funds were in danger of being shifted, asking them to speak at a rally to take place on the steps of City Hall on December 12th.

The facts regarding the \$700,000 and its history are somewhat confusing and difficult to establish, partly due to misleading statements by city officials and partly due to the Byzantine nature of the budget process at City Hall. As the Local Issues Committee understands it, the history of the Supplemental AIDS Funding is as follows.

After Mayor Agnos submitted his fiscal year (89-90) Activists at Dec. 12 rally at City Hall demand that \$700,000 budget, the Budget Analyst discovered a \$2 million surplus. A In frozen AIDS funds be restored. Much of these funds

Several other ACT UP/SF members represented other CBOs on the Task Force: Terry Beswick (Community Research Alliance), Jorge Contiñas (Coalition for Immigrant and Refugee Rights and Services), Mike Shriver (18th St. Services), Hank Wilson (PWA/SF), Chris Costa (Black Coalition on AIDS Vigil).

Zaps & Actions

April 20-23: Hundreds of activists from around the country went to Chicago for the ACT NOW AIDS Actions for Health Care to focus on the crisis in health care faced nationwide. Hosted by ACT NOW and ACT UP/Chicago, the weekend included a conference on AIDS and people of color as well. There also was a 24 hour vigil in front of Cook County Hospital, an under-funded, under-staffed public hospital, which

Trying to avoid what they referred to as "an impending social emergency," 50 prominent lesbians and gay men announced today that they would be spearheading a drive for lesbian and gay divorce.

Lucille McGuillicuttle, speaking for the National Lesbian and Gay Task Force, explained that the emergency has been created by the sudden increase in lesbian and gay marriages. "Practically no one got married in the sixtles or seventies," she explained.

"In the eighties, church weddings became fashionable," but still, they generally involved at most two people. Then came the March on Washington, "where thousands of lesbians and gay men got hitched." Since then, there have been mass weddings all over the place, ever in San Francisco's City Hall.

On the brink of tears, McGuillicuttic confessed, "I myself have been martied three times, and never to the same wombroom. Yet there has been nothing to mark the end of each relationship, unless you could be broken dishes, burned letters, and pet custody arrangements. If you can never say goodbye," she added, "you can never truly say hello." An album by that name will be released in the fall.

While gay leaders promised to "storm the capito" to win gay divorce, Lesbian and GAy Insurection (LAGAI) has already scheduled a "Mass Lesbian (Say Divorce," for June 22 at Harvey Milk Plaza. AGAI's abscence from the struggle for gay marriage has gone largely unnoticed in the community, but spokesperson Ethel M. explained, "If you can't lick them, unjoin them." Our motto is, "What Willie Brown hath joined together, pretry much anybody can put ass-under." The group will be offering mass viovorees for people married at mass weddings, individual and group divorces, and prospective divores for people planning to marry if Hawaii ever legalizes it.
